

Master Municipal Clerk (MMC)

The Master Municipal Clerk (MMC) is the second of the two professional designations offered by the International Institute of Municipal Clerks (IIMC). To qualify for entrance into the MMC program, an applicant must have already earned the Certified

Municipal Clerk (CMC) designation and must be a current member of the IIMC. The MMC program prepares the participants to perform more complex municipal duties. The educational requirements for the MMC are more complex and at a much higher level than those of the CMC program. The subject matters might be similar to those of the CMC courses; however, the breadth and depth of the MMC courses are more academically advanced. 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The Arizona Municipal Clerks' Academy is accredited by the International Institute of Municipal Clerks (IIMC) and counts as 12 points toward the 60 advanced education points required for Master Municipal Clerk (MMC) candidates. Each year the Arizona Academy provides 24 hours of instruction in the areas of public administration, interpersonal and organizational dynamics, and current issues and strategies. You may participate in multiple academies to accumulate points toward the advanced education requirement.

The course subjects for the education component of the MMC designation is an indication of the distribution of subject matters within the context of the International Institute of Municipal Clerks (IIMC) core educational requirements. The courses must fulfill the requirement of the IIMC Education Guidelines:

- 80% Public Administration and Organization
- 20% Electives
